Concourse D Widening

ATL is embarking on its most complex construction project with a \$1.4 billion program to expand Concourse D while continuing to keep the facility operational.

The project will increase the overall building footprint by widening the existing concourse from 60 feet up to 99 feet and extending its overall length by 288 feet.

The modernized Concourse D will feature larger holding areas, restrooms, concessions, as well as more space to move around. Apron level support spaces will also be rebuilt and expanded.

A combination of capacity and distribution improvements to mechanical, electrical, plumbing, and IT systems will be installed.

A new 34-aircraft parking configuration will accommodate the most demanding ADG III aircraft, such as the Boeing 737 Max and Airbus A321 Neo. Ultimately, the 34 gates will have capacity to handle more passengers than the existing 40 gates do today.




BACKGROUND AND HISTORY

Concourse D is one of four original concourses that opened in 1980 along with the Domestic Terminal, establishing the Central Passenger Terminal Complex (CPTC) at Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport.


Since the opening of Concourse D, a series of renovations have occurred over the years including a recent expansion to the concourse midpoint. Even with renovations and new concourse midpoint, the concourse remains dramatically undersized considering the significant number of passengers utilizing the facility.

Unlike Concourses A, B, and C which are 90 feet wide, Concourse D is only 60 feet wide. When the concourse opened, smaller aircraft used the concourse, and its size was adequate at that time. Larger aircraft are now using the concourse and its circulation corridor, holdrooms, concessions, and restrooms are undersized.

OPERATIONAL IMPACTS AND MITIGATION



Gate Closures

Up to eight gates will be closed for each of the six phases of construction.

Some temporary and permanent gating changes will occur for all carriers operating in the concourse.



Ramp 6 North Gates

To alleviate short-term gate closures during construction, a passenger holdroom facility with three new gates will be built at Ramp 6 North.

This 32,000 sf two-story facility will feature spacious holdrooms, concessions, restrooms and airline support spaces.



FUNDING & FINANCING PLAN


Concourse D is funded using General Airport Revenue Bonds (GARBs) and Passenger Facility Charges (PFCs).



Ramp 6 North Gates project is funded as follows:

- 42% or \$40 million will be covered by ATP Grant
- 58% or \$54.6 million will be covered by GARBs
